DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

August 2001

A couple months ago my family and I traveled home for a wedding. Since there are 28 grandchildren in the May clan, we should be good for quite a few years of get-together celebrations! On this trip, St. Raphael's of Naperville was our destination. As we entered the church I noticed a stone on the outside of the church with an inscription on it. I went out later and copied it down. It reads: I Cor 3:16 "You are the temple of God and the Spirit of God dwells in you." I am sure I have heard that before, but this time it struck a chord within me. This church building was a beautiful light-filled structure, the ceremony that day was touching and meaningful, the people there warm and caring family and friends. And this quote helped me feel and see the Spirit of God in those gathered there that day.

My Bible Study produced a couple more like quotes for me to contemplate: 1 Peter 2:4-6 "You, like living stones are being built into a Spiritual house to be a holy priesthood."; Eph. 2:19-22 " And in him you too are being built together to become a dwelling in which God lives by His Spirit."

My husband for years loved to stop and take pictures of old barns we would happen on as we traveled. It got to be a joke between us whenever we

saw one whether he should snap a picture of it! It was a nostalgic thing with the barns but also a sad feeling to see something built with care and much work now in disrepair and no longer in use. When I think of myself as a "temple of God", I wonder if I am a "beautiful light-filled structure" for his Spirit to dwell in or a temple in "disrepair" and unused for his purpose.

Thinking about being a temple of God could make me feel pretty special, which it should, but also it could give me a swelled head, a misconception of my importance. This passage from The Prayer of Jabez by Bruce Wilkinson put it all in perspective for me : "You do not become great; you become dependent on the strong hand of God. Your surrendered need turns into his unlimited opportunity. And He becomes great through you."

It was an "Ah" moment. My acceptance of "my need" for God allows him to enter my heart, to dwell within me, for me to be his holy priesthood, commissioned to share his Good News to those in my life. Well, I have to be honest, sometimes cobwebs gather, dust bunnies collect, the bright windows become grimy in this temple of my soul , but with Jesus there is always Hope - a time for sweeping out the dust of yesterday, raising a new barn, letting me be His opportunity of greatness, His holy temple.
