Mary Jane's Journal

December 29th 2001 5:10am

I've a dear friend, Helen, with whom I correspond regularly. How I cherish her writings that deeply encourage me, much like the letters of the Apostles must have, written to the people of Galatia, Philippi and Corinth. It occurred to me as I read Helen's last letter, that the Lord continues to speak to us through one another. With the Word written in our hearts, we are all walking Letters.

This morning's reading from Luke 2:22-35 is a favorite. It tells of Simeon whose faith listened closely to the Spirit who took him to the temple the day Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to be presented to God. Scripture tells us that daily, Simeon lived and walked a close life with his Lord. It was through this consistent encounter that he could hear the whisper of the Holy Spirit telling him that here was the long awaited Messiah. Simeon must have presented *himself* to the Lord each morning in order to have such a close relationship. Sounds so simple. Could it really be?

I am reminded of 6-year-old grandson Seth who will persistently work to gain my attention when he wants it. I can become so busy with "things" that I just half listen to this inquisitive and opinionated boy whom I can learn from and has much to tell me.

I think these examples are a key to learning to listen to the Spirit. We need to "present" ourselves to Jesus everyday, making ourselves available. The wisdom and knowledge of God are so often enfolded in things, encrypted in the everyday sighing and whisperings of our lives. It is not a secret code, just one that needs our attention and awareness that indeed, this loving God who came to be one of us *does* want to communicate with us intimately. Rather amazing, but I believe, so very true.

Through God, all of his people are connected! The sharing is so important; the communicating to others what God is doing for us or teaching us, whether through painful experiences or blessings. Cursillo helps us do this in the form of Group Reunion. Being involved with one another in such a way can help us each be "walking letters".

I shall close for today. It will be a busy day. God help me to slow down in my heart so I can walk with him and not run circles around him!

DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

I was just reading the paper, minding my own business, sitting in the lobby of the YMCA waiting for my son while he worked out in the weight room. The door swooshed open and close, little snippets of conversation buzzed in the background, phrases surfaced occasionally as I scanned the newspaper. Now and then I'd glance up and see a familiar face, most not looking my way. I was content being an observer as life streamed by.

Then there was a lull in the noise level and a quiet descended like a soft blanket. I noticed a threesome in a huddle, off to the side, out of the line of traffic. I resumed my reading figuring they were discussing the volleyball game, or exercise program before going their separate ways. I heard the rhythm of talking. And then it registered that it was the rhythm of "praying" that I was hearing.

Soon they finished. I looked up and caught the eye of one the women as she hugged one of her companions. To be honest I really wanted to get up and hug them too, but it was their moment. Still I wanted to recognize the specialness of seeing them grouped together in prayer, so I just smiled and quietly said, "Amen."

In a few moments I had been transformed from an observer to a participant when my heart had been touched by these women. Touched by their faith, taking whatever their need was to God, caring for each other, being church in sweats and sneakers, right where life was happening. I will never know what the "story" was. Even being a voracious lover of stories, this does not bother me, because I have found that the real satisfaction for me was not knowing the need but seeing the response to it.

I read a wonderful little book by Philip Gulley called *Home to Harmony*. In it the pastor, Sam Gardner, relates the time the women of the church made a beautiful quilt to auction off and hung it in the meeting house for all to see. One morning the sun streamed in through the window lighting up the quilt and someone saw the face of Jesus there. When word got out, people from all over lined up to see the quilt. Eventually, one of the ladies confessed to the pastor that she had accidentally spilled coffee on it and apparently didn't get it all out. It wasn't Jesus; it was Maxwell House!

The pastor admits a small part of him really wished it had been Him, but then he goes on to say, "But in my more thoughtful moments, I'm glad it wasn't Jesus. It troubled me that folks would drive three hundred miles to see Christ in a quilt, but wouldn't walk next door to see Him in their neighbor. I don't think we ought to look for Christ in a quilt. I think we ought to look for Christ in the poor, in the common, in the lady who rings up our groceries, in the man who mops the grocery floor, in the kid who delivers our pizza."

I saw Jesus that day at the YMCA in a circle of sweatshirt clad women, being there for each other. And I know He is there in many parts of my life - some I see and some I am blind to. If I become a participant and let Him touch my heart, making it sensitive to His spirit, He will appear to me in many forms, in many ways, at any time. It makes life exciting, never knowing where He will manifest Himself, keeping me on my toes and alert to His grace and blessings in my day.
