DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

With paintbrush held high and enveloped almost to her ankles in my red apron, Madeline contemplated her artwork and announced, "When I grow up I am going to be an artist." Then my 4 year- old granddaughter looked up at me and inquired, "And what are you going to be when you grow up, Grandma?" "Well," I told her, "I've *always* wanted to be a Grandma, so I guess I've gotten one of my wishes already!"

Although I know I have "matured" since childhood, somewhere before the age of 50 I decided that age is only important if it shows how much you have progressed, so in essence I don't consider myself "all grown up" yet and know I have so much more to learn. I had time to reflect on this as we made the 10-hour drive to Arcadia, Michigan in May where our 2nd daughter, Julie, was to work in a family camp for the summer. She said it is like living in a bubble of caring and camaraderie – a peaceful respite from the stresses of college life.

Years ago our family stayed a week at Camp Arcadia and I can still remember being lulled to sleep by the sounds of the waves lapping against the sandy shores outside our window. The days had moments of sharing, leisure walks on the beach, relaxing quietly on the patio, craft shop projects with the children, camp talent shows and volleyball games after supper, games for the kids and inspirational speakers for the adults and TV. was not even thought of.

The beginning and ending of our trip were such a contrast. After staying the night in Arcadia and hugging Julie good-bye for the summer, we made a few more stops in Michigan and ended our trip with a visit to Greenfield Village in Dearborn, Michigan. This is an educational and entertaining village and museum that Henry Ford began in 1929 that shows the mechanical progress our country has gone through.

I think of Greenfield Village and the growth in ideas and technology that our country made in such a short time and I marvel at how it has improved life and made day to day living so much easier. In my mind I picture the working farm that was there, the time it took to cook, clean and raise their own food. Then my mind sees the giant locomotives in the reconstructed round house that changed the landscape of our country bringing people and goods to the wilderness, and even more inspiring, the buildings where the Wright brothers built their airplane, and Thomas Edison perfected the light bulb. What exciting times of change and growth.

So how do I put these two worlds together – the peace and spiritual tranquility and the energy and always changing technology of our world? At the Ladies Lighthouse Retreat I attended this last April, the speaker Annie Chapman spoke of the "Joy of Overcoming", the "Joy in Balance" and the "Joy in Contentment". Just these titles give me pause to contemplate my life – to see the meshing of spiritual and physical wants and needs, the ways that I am enriched and challenged by physical comforts and my own spirituality.

My granddaughter is very observant and one day asked me another simple but meaningful question, "Grandma, where is the Jesus necklace you always wear?" That day I had forgotten to put it on and it warmed me that she recognized it as part of my identity. And that question reconfirmed again how essential Jesus is in my life. He is the answer to where I find "Joy", "Contentment" and "Balance" in life. He is the means to becoming "what I want to be when I grow up." He is the point at which all my life radiates out from and absorbs both energy and peace from. He has made us beings with inventive/creative minds and souls whose spirituality continually grows in wisdom if we look to Him.

And He has given us the gift of little children to ask us questions that make us laugh and ponder life and then pause..... to look deep into their eyes to see his loving face.
