DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

A year and a half ago my husband gave me a book on painting flowers on rocks. Well, as usual, it took me awhile to get all the materials together and started but it has been another adventure for me. Somewhere in all of this I began to sing that song with the words, "Love, it is a flower and you're its only seed." Now where do you think that came from?!

I love the way God jiggles thoughts around in my mind, offers a bit here and there in the puzzle until I start to see the picture. I ran across an article a few months back in the newspaper by Jacquelyn Mitchard that was titled "A simple key to a better life: Don't be a jerk." It was not a spiritual piece by any means, but it made some good points on how life is improved if you are a considerate, caring person. It also brought up the thought for me that you can be a nice person without being a Christian but you cannot truly be a good Christian without being a nice person. All of Jesus' teachings point to that premise. This doesn't mean that Christians don't ever do unkind things or make mistakes in their lives, but only that they should always be attempting to become "nice people" more often than not - in other words, more like Jesus - the epitome of goodness.

A little devotional, Living Faith, presented another interesting perspective on being a good person in their June 24, 2002 entry. Amy Welborn said, "When we consider holiness, sometimes we think in far too small a box. Certainly, there are qualities we find in all the people we call saints, whether those people are formally canonized or known only to us. These are people who live the virtues, who share Christ's love unreservedly. Where we get trapped is in our mistaken impression that there is just a single model of holiness, that it is all about being meek, mild and simple." She shares that each of us are unique in our holiness and in the person that God has called us to be.

I am constantly being inspired by God's good people. There is the oral hygienist I met who traveled with her church to India on a mission trip, the young people who volunteer their time at the nursing home near me, the friends I know who teach religious education to the youth at our church, the people I see being loving caregivers to family members, faithful friends to those in need of support and comfort, and joyful Christians who brighten my day with their inner light.

There are so many ways to plant the seeds of His love in this life, for us to be nurturers of peace and joy, gardeners of goodness, sharing our "unique holiness" with others, watching love bloom and "glow" with His light. We are his holy priesthood who on accepting his call are forever thirsting for Him in our lives and feeling the fire within cannot help but pass that flame to others. Somewhere inside I knew all this, but a paint book, a growing pile of rocks and some "music" from the Heavenly Maestro helped paint the bigger picture for me to appreciate ... always an adventure with Him.
