Lay Director's Message

"Make a Friend. Be a Friend. Bring a friend to Christ."

I am not sure how to approach presenting this without offending anyone so I must rely on the Spirit to direct these words because what I want is the strengthening of the Quincy Cursillo movement. I need to address sponsoring of candidates.

Think about this statement that has been drilled into our heads. Read it more than once. "Make a friend. Be a friend. Bring that friend to Christ." It is easy to gloss over this statement when we have heard and read it so many times.

When we adhere to this statement then we can eliminate so many headaches, heartaches, and misunderstandings. When we understand the statement, a candidate's application cannot be filled out in a few seconds even if the weekend is in two days. If we are being a friend then we know this person. We know about their health issues. We want this individual to have the best weekend possible, which also means there is a team prepared to give this special person what it takes to have an enjoyable weekend without disrupting the flow and dynamics of the weekend.

When we speak of health issues, and most all of us have health issues to some degree, I mean issues that need special attention. For example, if a person cannot hear well, they may need to sit at a particular table or have a hearing assisted device. When it comes to medication, we need to know what time the candidate needs to take their medication or determine if it would be better if they kept their watch. Will under or over medication create a medical emergency for this candidate?

Other examples of health issues may include a sleeping disorder where they cannot stay awake long enough to experience the weekend. Maybe it takes an hour or two to wake them up. Do they snore too loud for another person in their room or need a fan to fall asleep? Do they need a wheelchair or special provisions for seating? Do they need a hospital type bed?

We are all spiritually challenged or we wouldn't be on these weekends but is the candidate physically, or mentally challenged, or possibly need a care giver? If you are a friend to these candidates you know of their needs.

This type of health information needs to be highlighted on the candidate's application so that we, as a board, can determine, prior to acceptance, how we can prepare for this candidate so that we are not faced with a last minute realization that we are not prepared for this candidate at this time.

Lack of knowledge of health issues places undue burden on those who are to be leading the weekend and the possibility of making the candidate feel as though they are a burden, which takes away from what we want them to experience. The weekends have to follow the assigned schedule or we risk losing the flow and dynamics and possibly deny a candidate the knowledge of how to live their Fourth Day.

To all sponsors and those who encourage individuals to make a Cursillo, thank you! We have been blessed to have many candidates this past year. You take on a big responsibility to be a sponsor. Take it seriously! Be a friend! The new cursillistas need to know they are a part; they need to know how to keep the Spirit of the weekend alive in their hearts; they need to be a part of a family. Get them started into a group reunion.

One last thought is that our closings on Sunday have been poorly attended. The last weekend #268, I made an announcement on Saturday night about making a commitment to attend and in fact the attendance was good on Sunday. We need to support these new cursillistas. They stand up to give themselves to us but how many of us are there to accept the gift. How many are there to open the gift they are giving? We are family and they want to see us in the light.

Discovering and Celebrating

It was very quiet in the Saguaro Desert as a handful of us began our two hour trek with the Park Ranger one sunny but cool afternoon in Arizona. The walk was entitled "What's for Dinner" and the Ranger began to educate us on what the animals of the desert ate to survive. We only encountered a couple of the critters because it was too cold for them to venture out yet this spring.

However, we did learn to look for signs of their presence - the tumble of stacked debris which the packrat called home; the holes in the ground that alerted us to the abode of jackrabbits, ground squirrels, kangaroo rats, desert turtles; pecked out holes in the big saguaro cactus where a variety of birds nested; the footprints of coyote in the mud left by recent rains and the deep scratches left in the dirt marking "their" territory; nibbles in the cactus by jackrabbits and big chomps taken by the javelina, a small, wild pig looking creature. And every so often the Ranger would stop and fish out the skull of some animal from her backpack and discuss how we could tell what they ate by the type of teeth they had. Although we had only caught a glimpse of a rabbit and a ground squirrel, we felt like we had encountered the spirit of the desert in the signs of the wildlife we found along the way.

Likewise, signs of God were scattered through our days, as we vacationed far from home in Arizona this March. The distant mountains and desert landscapes were a beauty He gifted us with and had His stamp on. He was there as David and I found the right words to express our love of our faith with relatives we spent time with. God sat in the hot tub with us as we listened to a woman relate her faith journey and her husband's illness that was covered by God's grace. His hands were in the circle of hands that prayed

together around the table we shared with old friends. The presence of God's comfort was felt when we traveled to see my very ill uncle, I hugged him, told him I loved him and said good-bye to him, probably for the last time.

Through the people we encountered, the new experiences we had, the connection we felt as we celebrated mass in the different churches we attended, signs of God were there for us. "What's for Dinner?" - His love, grace, joy and hope are in abundance to feed us and strengthen us on our trek through life, be it desert, mountain or prairie. His signs are everywhere to lead the way to His Table of Life to partake, celebrate and share with others. It's a feast not to be missed - don't be late for dinner!
