Those Who Have Gone Before Us Marked With the Sign of Faith

We are fortunate to have this community, this Cursillo community. Just as in any close families, there are times of struggle and times to rejoice, there are times to work and times to rest, there are times to cry and times to radiate with a smile, there are times to talk and times to listen, there are times to give of oneself and times to receive life from others, there are times to pray and times to let go.

This past year, there have been many pass from our community, most recently Bill Gilmore and Bob Schepers. There have been many who have had to deal with sickness within or within their family and friends. Hopefully our new "Book of Remembrance" will become a tool used to remember those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith and a witness to our faith among the living.

On May 25, 2010, Bob Schepers passed away. Bob was instrumental in bringing Cursillo to Quincy and in many ways the "father" of Quincy Cursillo. The following is a shortened excerpt from the Catholic Times March 5, 1989 and just prior to the 100th Cursillo in Quincy. Bob is interviewed by Ed Wojcicki.



Bob Schepers

"In Quincy, the TEC renewal movement arrived three years before Cursillo did. In 1971, Schepers attended the first Great River Teens Encounter Christ weekend as an observer. He was so enthralled by it that he told Father Harry Speckman, OFM, at Quincy College there was to be more to it than the TEC program for teens. So Father Speckman told Schepers about Cursillo, which is for adults, and said a weekend was coming up two weeks later in Peoria.

Schepers, Tony Wiewel and Rich Halle went to Peoria, and in the next few years a few others from Quincy also traveled to Peoria for Cursillo. Schepers' plan was to use the Peoria Cursillo as a way of recruiting adults to be team members for the Great River TEC, which had gotten off to a good start in Quincy.

Over the years the small band of Quincy cursillistas met regularly, and then in the fall of 1974 Schepers had a dream two consecutive nights in which he heard a masculine voice say "bring Cursillo to Quincy." That led him to call Father Clarence Chambers, OFM, then rector of the OLA Franciscan Seminary, and said they needed to talk.

"I told him I wanted the B wing of the seminary Dec. 12-15 (in 1974) for Cursillo, and he said, 'What's that?'"

Schepers explained the Cursillo renewal program to the priest, and as Schepers tells it today, Father Chambers "shut his eyes for approximately a minute and he opened his eyes and smiled and said, 'It's yours.'"

A team of willing cursillistas from Peoria was put together, and there were 84 candidates and team members on that first Quincy weekend – quite a large group, considering that an average might be 40 or 50.

Thus came to Quincy a program that has permanently changed the outlook of the Catholic community in the Springfield diocese. About 3,000 men and women have experienced in the past 14 years through Cursillo what it means to live a life of piety, study, and action in the context of a Christian community.

Schepers mentioned that cursillistas still seek him out occasionally just to talk – and the trust level to make that possible occurred during the Cursillo weekend."

Since this article was written in 1989, we have now reached Cursillo weekend #272 and the Cursillo community in Quincy, over the course of 35 years, has had approximately 7,000 people attend the weekend. We owe much of this to Bob Schepers who listened to the voice of God that night so many years ago.

Many of us have stories and witnesses that we could share about Bob and how he touched our lives. DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

Dear Lord,

On our visit to my sisters in South Carolina this May I knew you would be there but I didn't know how or where or when you would present your face. On the Sunday we were there, we attended St. Paul the Apostle Church just down the street from my sister's house. After celebrating the Mass we discovered something extraordinary we had overlooked the last time we had been there. My husband said to me, "Terri, look at the Stations of the Cross. Aren't they different?" Looking up I saw spaced across the back wall of the church very large 2 by 3 ft. framed pieces of art for each station. We wandered back and began to closely examine them. Each one was done in a different style using a different medium - pencil, watercolor, pastels, oil, print, or photo collage.

On reaching the end of the stations we were approached by a girl who asked if we would want to meet the artist, who happened to be her mother and was there in the church. We said yes and proceeded to listen as the artist told us how the stations came about after 2 years of work, surprisingly funded by a public grant and exhibited in a gallery before being hung in the church.

David and I left the church looking at each other in wonder at what we had just experienced. The art work had brought tears to my eyes; the talk with the artist brought a sense of peace and feeling of rightness to my heart, knowing that your Holy Spirit had been at work in her as she accomplished this project. She also took the time to give us the readings for the Stations. The last reading says:

"You are called to question and challenge your assumptions, your judgments.

You are called to bear your life with hope,

to offer comfort and help to others,

to love, and to accept God's love for you.

You are called to recognize God in yourself and in every other life."

Thank you for the open eyes to see your sacrifice and love through those works of art, for the ears to hear the witness of the artist and for the girl who brought us together - your face revealed.
