## Area Reps and Why They Are Important to You

Area Representatives recently met at the Retreat Center in Quincy to learn more about their roles and what they can do to facilitate better communication and involvement within their local Cursillo communities. Each parish or town is eligible to have one representative and one assistant that is chosen by the local Ultreya and submitted to the Lay Director and Board for approval.

Your Area Representative acts as a liaison between your parish or area and the Board. They are encouraged to attend all Board meetings to represent you and, in turn, bring information back to share with their community. They should share information with their pastors and keep an active list of who has made Cursillo and who is in Group Reunions.

It is also the responsibility of the Area Representative to be available to sponsors when they have candidates to help answer any questions, to handle post-Cursillo activities, ultreya's and assist in getting Cursillistas in Group Reunions.

The Quincy Cursillo website has a listing of the Area Reps under the "Board Information" tab. There have been several recent changes so please refer to the new listing to find the Area Rep that covers your area. Please contact them to let them know your contact information so they can keep you updated on Cursillo activities. Many areas have their own newsletter with local information. Help them help you stay informed. They are your resource if you have questions.

If your parish or area is not represented, choose someone from your local area and nominate them to the Board to fill this position.

## Lay Directors Message

An important part of the Cursillo experience as we walk our Fourth Day is communication. We all have different perspectives of life. Our view has something to offer another so they can have a clearer understanding or a confirming of what they do see. I again ask for goals for our Cursillo movement. There is an old story of a man in a village who would carry water in a cracked pot. Day after day he would walk through the village leaving a trail of water. The people would stop and watch and laugh and criticize. They would question: why does he carry all this water and only have half a jar full when he reaches home? In the days and weeks and years green began to show up along his route. Wheat and grass and flowers and trees began to grow.

Through these cracks we find so shameful in our lives, flows living water and if we go back along that route we will find lives growing because of that water. We learned through the Cursillo experience, the sound of the whisper from the Spirit and we came to know the feel of Jesus' knock on our heart. We learned to rise above our failure and continue to share the gift we have been given and that is only through Jesus' redeeming love.

Celebrate this Easter season! May the Lord continue to bless you with His love, joy and peace and may you feel the warmth of His embrace.
