From the Lay Director's Notebook

A FEW PARTING THOUGHTS

The last two years seem to have flown by, but then in retrospect so have the last twenty years since Pat & I moved to Illinois from Arizona. Remembering those early years here brings a tear to the eye. Arriving in Jacksonville from Phoenix to find no visible signs of Cursillo seemed like a nightmare, and I felt as if I had left the physical desert of the Southwest only to settle into the spiritual desert of the Midwest. After all Cursillo had been our support system, both spiritually and physically through a couple of really tough years, including the last one of unemployment. But a small note in the Catholic newspaper of the Springfield Diocese referred to a Cursillo Movement in Quincy and put me in touch with Bob Schepers, and once again we were "home", back with the movement we loved so much.

The welcome we received from the Quincy area's cursillistas has been absolutely wonderful, we couldn't have asked for anything more. DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

The other day I looked out my back window and spied our neighbor's cat slipping into the woods. What a life, I thought, a cushy place to sleep at night and the woods to roam by day. Then I thought, that had its risks too. We have seen fox in our backyard, heard coyotes howling, seen hawks roosting in the trees - there are risks with most things in life.

Now it is the Season of Advent, the time of preparation for the coming of the Messiah. Lights are going up around town, trees are being decorated, the bell is being rung outside the stores calling us to give to those less fortunate. We are counting our blessings, gathering together with family, friends and our church community to mark this holy time of year. What was the price paid for all of this, the risks taken?

A young woman said "yes" to the call from God to be the mother of the Savior; she risked her reputation, the hand of her betrothed, and her parent's belief in her. A man said "yes" to taking her as his wife, even though she was pregnant, not with his child; he took a step of faith to be her husband. Our God became a helpless child, dependent on two humans to take care of him; he would feel cold, hunger, pain, frustration, and despair. He would pay the price and risk all to bring us life eternal.

We should feel joy this time of year as we reflect on the happenings that set in motion the giving of the Greatest Gift. I remember back a few years ago when I was putting up the nativity scene under our tree with my granddaughter. I was going to keep the baby Jesus in a drawer until Christmas but when I left the room my granddaughter took Him out and put Him back in the manger. She didn't like baby Jesus to be all by Himself. She was right. He doesn't want to be by Himself. Do I take a risk and say "yes" to Him in my life, including Him in all of it, keeping Him with me always, not tucked away in a drawer to come out on special occasions? Do I take a risk and share Him with others by example, with love and concern?

Now is the Season of Advent. Light the candle of Hope, Faith, Love and Peace. Feed the Fire of Joy and prepare your heart for the coming of the King!
