## Reflections from John Runge Quincy Cursillo's New Lay Director



As nature settles into its winter hibernation and as I try to adjust to the cold, ice, and snow, I am faced with the reality that a new year has begun, and again I must look back to remember if I tried to plant any seeds. This past year would seem to be filled with our nation and world dealing with many troubles and also our personal lives but what kind of seeds did I plant, or did I sow anything. Maybe I thought I could take my chances in life alone and keep my seeds stored for myself to consume. I could ride the wheel of fortune with all the confidence of knowing my ABCs and life was mine for the taking, all mine. Troubles, failures, shortcomings, and hurts, I have them. They are what are called opportunities; opportunities to see the good in life, opportunities to share how challenges have brought joy to my life. They have helped me to be humble and realize that I am losing my strength to be in control and that I must rely increasingly more each day on other people and Jesus with His control of my life. Then I begin to realize my seeds, my gifts are no more than baggage to weigh me down each day and are there to be given away.

As I stand outside in the icy cold and breathe in deeply, I can experience that cold of isolation and the realization that I am given a new year to deliberately plant seeds for new life to blossom. In the first letter of John 1:1-4, although written about one hundred years after Jesus made His Ascension, and amid all the trials and tribulations at the time, we can find the power of the seeds that Jesus had planted bursting forth with life. The disciples could feel and see and hear Jesus alive. Their faith was not a noun but a verb. Their faith was alive, growing, reaching out and greater than any failure, shortcoming or hurt they might have been a part of. They experienced a joy so overpowering that it could not be left under a bushel basket. It had to be shared to receive an even greater joy. I too must dare to face the future, knowing that Jesus is more powerful than any power of the past, present or future and that there will be opportunities to see the joy in trials.

This new year, I am given an opportunity to be the Lay Director for the Quincy Cursillo movement. By knowing the past lay directors, I feel humbled and question my abilities to fill in behind them. Tom Deters has done an exceptional job organizing and computerizing many areas of paper work. This was done on the heels of Jim Nevins' work on the rooster book, which is ongoing. Tom has been a real asset to the movement in terms of his skills spiritually and in terms of dealing with difficult decisions. While he has made it easier to slide into his seat, it will be more difficult for me to provide the same wide spectrum of service. Thanks Tom for all your good work! I want to say a special thanks to all the past lay directors for their time and dedication in the past and present, they are an important reason why the seeds are blossoming.

To give you a glimpse of myself so you might feel free to share with me, I was born and raised in Keokuk, Iowa. I come from a family of six kids. Mom and dad and two of my sisters have made Cursillo. I have been married to Patti for 34 years and we have six children, all who have made TEC. I made Cursillo #63 in 1983 and Dick Mitchell was Rector. Patti made the

following #64. I became Rector for Cursillo #114 in 1991. We have been area representatives since it was first started and we have both been on the Cursillo board. Presently, all the kids are gone from home and we have four grandchildren.

I am a Eucharistic minister, lector and sing in a guitar group at All Saints parish. I am on the parish council and enjoy teaching faith formation to 9th graders. I do construction which is commercial and industrial. I am a foreman but I enjoy being hands on, running heavy equipment, concrete, to finish carpentry. I was raised on the farm all my life and still enjoy doing maintenance work, taking care of the cows, baling hay, and bulldozer work. While I used to race motor cycles as a hobby, I still like woods riding but most any more is done on a six-wheel Polaris. My relaxation is the out doors. I am on the shy side so don't get an impression I'm stuck up, I'm far from it. When I get on a topic of faith formation I can find plenty of words and will definitely challenge. Challenging people is important to me. I listen, except at times at home having my selective hearing on. Usually I listen closer to what is being said from the person's spirit than to the words being delivered. Words are deceiving. Anyway that's enough about me for now.

This way I know you will have thought your way through it and it will give the board time to carefully consider a response. Important concerns cannot be answered without all of the board responding.

We have a great board at this time and Ed Holthaus is coming in to replace my spot. He has been very active with the building and grounds committee. I am confident each member of the board, our secretary, treasurer, and assistant rector, all are positively committed to the successfulness of Jesus transforming our lives and the lives of the candidates to come.

While I question what will be expected of me, you must too question what I expect from you. Remember, I said I like to challenge. I expect everyone to go out and deliberately plant seeds. No, everyone should not be expected to sign on the line every time but by reaching out and giving away your gifts others will see and want to nurture that life. There are many thirsting and how do we get them to drink?

Palanca is much of that, committing oneself to do something. Why should we have to worry about the palanca chart being filled? It's easy out of convenience to stop in the palanca chapel but it takes commitment to sign up a month ahead of time and in the end be there. Is it out of convenience that we expect to sponsor people? ## Fr. Bill Burton Presents Scripture Study Weekend

Fr. Bill Burton, Scripture Scholar, will present a weekend studying the writings of St. Paul the Apostle

The figure of St. Paul towers, not only over the New Testament, but over the first two centuries of church history. This year, dedicated by the Holy Father to St. Paul, provides the perfect opportunity for Catholics to take a serious look at this amazing follower of Christ and the letters he has left behind.

Our early sessions will focus on Paul, the Pharisee. To understand Paul's writings we must look at his own religious convictions and how he emerges from Pharisaic Judaism and how he reacts to his former religious mind-set. But Paul was also thoroughly Hellenistic. This cultural context also has an important influence on Paul and will be considered as we try to understand him within both his cultural and religious context.

Next we will look at the significance of the Hellenistic letter as the twenty-seven works are letters! Twenty-one of the New Testament's Paul towers over all others for his influence and power. We will look at the form of the Hellenistic letter and how Paul so effectively presses this form into service for the pastoral formation of his early Christian communities.

Finally, we'll look at the seven Pauline letters. From these we will try to glean an insight into the theology of Paul so we can better appreciate his genius and measure the tremendous influence this man has had on Christianity.

The weekend events will start at 7:30 pm Friday evening January 30th and finish after lunch on Sunday February 1st.

Cost per person is set up so that participants may stay overnight or commute.
