MESSAGE FROM YOUR LAY DIRECTOR

Dear Cursillo Family -

It was so good to hear your comments regarding the topic of "Reverence in the Chapel" that was presented to you on a recent weekend. I am very happy that some of you took the time to reflect on this issue and then to let me know how you feel. It was interesting, but not surprising, to find that many Cursillistas, anticipate with much enthusiasm, meeting old and new friends in the chapel to "catch up" and renew the friendship they share with Jesus. That is good stuff! However, there are some who would like a more quiet atmosphere in the chapel and feel a more social area should be relocated to another area. So how do we reach a happy medium? As a result of comments I have thus far received, let me throw out what we will try to do to please the majority.

There will no longer be any sanctified hosts left in the main chapel. Instead they will be stored in the main palanca chapel to be distributed as needed during any Mass. Therefore, please feel comfortable visiting with your friends, but only until the announcements begin. Once they are completed, it would seem fitting that we begin a more quiet time to prepare our minds and hearts for the Mass.

I'm asking for your cooperation in the large palanca chapel by observing a quiet atmosphere in the room at all times. This is the **room designated specifically for prayer** and I feel we need to honor the purpose for which it was designed. Keep in mind, that this is also the new storage area for the sanctified hosts. If you feel a need to visit, you are welcome to step outside to the hall or even go into one of the smaller chapels. Let's all try to give our utmost respect to one another in the palanca chapel.

And now, let's address the "kiss of peace" during Mass. Nothing feels better than a warm hug from someone you love. But, if that "someone you love" is across the room and you have to push through and ignore fellow Cursillistas, without even acknowledging their presence, then the true meaning and sincerity of that hug has perhaps been lost along the way. Could I please suggest that we hug those in our immediate area and eliminate squeezing through the aisles to get from one end to another. That person sitting right next to you might need your hug more than you could ever imagine. That person sitting next to you should be as much of a reflection of Jesus as anyone else could be. I encourage you to spread your love to those in your immediate vicinity, and "throw kisses" to those farther away.

I am proud to serve as your Lay Director and am honored to serve you in the best way I can. I want to serve Jesus in every way I can. I have found that sometimes Jesus calls me to make decisions that may not always be well received by everyone. Please don't ever hesitate to share your interests and/or concerns with any Board member or me. That is what we are here for – the good of all, and the opportunity for us to walk a closer walk with Jesus.

As I sign off this month I would like you to reflect upon: "As we walk with God, we take on His thoughts, His principles, His attitudes. We take on His heart. Walk with Him long enough and you will come to know His heart." And fellow Cursillistas, we were after all created to "know Him, to love Him, and to serve Him."
