From the Lay Director's Notebook Help Needed Amid Dwindling Numbers

HELP! - We had a very successful workday on September 23 and the efforts of those who came were truly appreciated. Now as the time for our projected move to the north side of the building approaches we are scheduling two more such events. On November 18 we will hold another workday with painting and cleaning to be our main focus (at least at this moment) so we ask you all to help us and turn out with your paint brushes, rollers, and pots and/or your buckets, rags and other cleaning materials. Once again the Cursillo will provide lunch. An even bigger effort will be conducted the week of December 11 - 15, when Ed Holthaus will be there that week to direct the actual move of bedding, stored items, etc from the south side to the north. **Please contact Ed either by phone or by email to let him know when he can count on seeing you there to help. Ed's email is holthaus@adams.net and his home phone is 217-222-2198.** If the turnout is large enough we might even get it done in one day.

NUMBERS! - Recently we have seen a trend in dwindling numbers and are not sure what it all means. We have seen the numbers of candidates for weekends dropping into the low

teens. Case in point, the November weekend was 24 at one point then fell to somewhere around 15, then recovered to 25 and finally settled at 18. At the same time we have noted that the number of people attending Candlelight is down and the number at closings is way down, sometimes barely 2/3 of the south chapel is filled. Going hand in hand with the above items, filling the hours on the palanca chapel chart is becoming increasingly difficult, as is the recruiting of servers for meals. At the start of the Sponsor's Hour for the November weekend there were 17 hours of unfilled time in the palanca chapel.

Perhaps we need to rethink the number of weekends we are currently holding and reduce from the 10 we now do to the 8 we formerly held. This whole matter of shrinking numbers leads me to ask you the Cursillo Community, what you feel may be the reason and ask for your aid in finding a solution, be it either a more rigorous effort on the part of Cursillistas to recruit candidates or to reduce the number of weekends

DISCOVERING AND CELEBRATING

This morning I started my treadmill warm-up by singing the beautiful theme song from the Oct. Ladies Cursillo, Amazing Love. As my feet picked up speed so did my thoughts. People, talks, funny incidents flashed through my mind as I relived the happenings of the retreat.

Well, my partner in Food Service happens to be a teacher and she used a little trick that teachers sometimes implement to get the attention of their students. When we needed quiet for an announcement she would cup her hands around her mouth and say loudly, "If you hear me, clap ONCE." With women you know that talking is high on their priority list, so it was going to take more than that. So after half the ladies clapped once she would say, "If you hear me, clap TWICE." With women you also know they are very curious what is going on around them so that usually did the trick. We had quite a bit of fun with this though since there were a few ladies who needed a bit more instructions on how it worked!

After a bit of reminiscing about the last few days, I took up a new daily scripture devotional that was donated for the book table. It's called One Minute Bible for Starters - a 90-day Journey for new Christians. Well, technically I am not a "new" Christian but I feel every day I have something new to learn about being a Christian, so I figured I qualified. One of the points made with quotes from John and Jeremiah was how much "God draws you to Himself." We have a free will to choose to follow Him but He is constantly working in our lives through people, events, and places to "draw" us to Him. The writer pointed out that with all the efforts that God puts forth in making us His, it "Looks like your hardest decision was trying to say no all this time." Whoa, that made me stop (figuratively, of course, since I was on the treadmill) and let it soak in a bit. All those obstacles, all those "no's" I presented to the King, instead of the worshipful bow of "yes" to His presence in my life paraded across my mind. He did not lock the door in disgust but went out into the streets and the byways looking for me, to draw me back to Him.

At this point in my meditating a picture came to mind of God standing with His hands cupped around His mouth shouting, "If you hear me, clap once! If you hear me, clap twice!" I have a feeling He was shouting a bit longer for me. And then He adds, "If you hear me, don't stop clapping!!" It made me laugh out loud to realize that God had gotten His point across once more about being a part of my life, whether I am on the treadmill, at a retreat, spending time with my family, or with a total stranger. He will put forth the effort, He just asks me to open my hearts to hear him and to clap with joy, wonder and awe at His love for me, for us. It is a clap that can be heard around the world if we pass it on to our neighbor as He asks us to do in our 4th Day. It's so much more fun to clap with someone else, to laugh, to cry, to share with someone else - that's the Church, the Body of Christ.

I had been so involved that when I looked at the distance covered I realized I was almost to Payson. I would have gotten to Ursa but my treadmill was facing the wrong way! ...Well, He thought it was funny - I heard Him clap!
