Lay Director's Message

After making a cursillo and now from the highs you can see the bottom, you vision back to recall what took place and possibly try to rekindle the flame the Spirit had engulfed you in. Hopefully, you begin to question and wonder within yourself, "What is it, that the cursillo family wants of me?" My response is:

- We need people who listen to the people in their environments, not to the misleading words, but who listen to the Spirit moving through these people's lives,
- Who listen to God in the stillness of life,
- Who listen to Jesus as He walks the walk every day.
- We need people who experience, people who open their eyes to a life alive and witness to how it renews and motivates.
- We need people who discern life's purpose and goals, people willing to doubt and question but faith filled enough to step out knowing that Jesus is along side and the Spirit will provide the power and strength for action.
- We need people willing to learn each day but especially willing to open the gift of knowledge that each person will bring.
