## Fee Increase & New Application

## Lay Director's Message

The start of this last women's Cursillo weekend became quite the challenge for many as the snow from Mother Nature was blown forcefully upon this region. I talked with a few about their adventure to Quincy and it was definitely a challenge. They were focused on getting their candidate to the weekend. They may have been shaking a little from the distant drive and their eyes a bit stressed from worry of being safe but they made it. Hopefully all had safe journeys to and back from Quincy through the weekend activities. Even myself and Patti, as we headed home Thursday evening, were forced into going 20 mi./hr for a while as the car was pelted with snow to a point of not being able to see. I was focused too; I wanted to get home so my speed would creep up and I'd hear some chatter, "You're going too fast! How can you see?!!"

I remember a time when our family was young, we went to church and as normal the kids would run to the car afterwards while we would be talking to others. Eventually we made it to the car and drove off toward home. Suddenly after we had driven maybe ten blocks a question came up, "Where's Aaron?!!" I thought internally kind of like, "Why are you asking me? I'm just the designated driver!" My focus was on getting home, breakfast, chores, riding the motorcycle... Aaron still reminds us of this. I think it may have effected him more than we realized. I was thinking of myself more than of the family and we all fail in those ways. We all, as a Cursillo family, need to lose focus of ourselves and become a part of the present as it is happening for others.

If we are a part of the present for others, we will act as family in a respectful way, especially on our Cursillo weekends. Prior to the weekend, if you are claiming to be a Cursillo "buddy", you will sign up for palanca chapel and food server and keep your buddy in prayer. This is a commitment you can joyfully make for them.

**Thursday evening**, as we try to bring forth the candidates to the conference room, quiet yourself so as to bring about respect for the rector/rectora. You are the one to start setting the tone for the weekend at this point. After cleaning up any mess you may have made, go to the main chapel to pray during the Sponsor's Hour. This is mainly a quiet time. While the speaker must be conscious of having a good voice volume, you also must be quiet so all can hear. Once the ceremony is finished, you need to clear the chapel and the foyer outside the chapel because this is where the candidates come in. If conversations are to be continued, they need to be done in the letter writing room or up that east corridor. Respect also the quiet of the Palanca Chapel. The purpose of this room is for prayer and with the real presence of Jesus exposed, another dimension of respect comes into focus. The way the room is decorated should be to draw our focus to Jesus. We should be able to experience His transforming presence in us and recognize the need to bond as family through prayer to transform the lives of the candidates. Signing up for palanca chapel is not about ownership for an hour, rather it is about an opportunity to receive grace through commitment for another. It is about respect.

**Saturday evening**, please be conscious of where you park. There are fire lanes and if parked in these areas you will be fined. Most generally, the south chapel door is open to enter the building, so overflow parking is encouraged in the south parking lot. Ten minutes prior to the start of the Eucharistic celebration there are announcements...please take your seats and be quiet. The board tries to keep you updated through these announcements. During the sign of peace don't lose your focus of what we are celebrating. Once the closing song has finished, quiet yourself. Make sure that you and those around you are ready to be a light to the candidates and not a microphone. This is a quiet time for the candidates to experience God's light through us. The song we sing is not to be a concert but more nearly a whisper. Sing very softly! Do not delay the candidates by extended hugs or talking. Once all of the team and candidates have passed by and it is possible, leave the chapel in silence. The team and candidates need quiet to assemble around the altar and to absorb the power of the Spirit at this time of the weekend. They need this for their own metanoia and any distraction may take away from their experience. When leaving the chapel and no one is collecting the candles, take charge and collect them and return them to the storage room going into the main chapel. Do not remain in the lobby, go down to the letter writing room or that same corridor and talk if it is needed.

**Sunday closing** is a real gift to the family from the candidates. I'm not sure why anyone would not want to be there; to accept the gifts that are being given. Come a little early and help set up and clean up if possible. Welcome the new candidates when you have an opportunity. On Sunday or Saturday don't reserve seating. If you come into chapel find your place and experience the possibility of getting to know someone you didn't know before. Respect others who come to chapel to sit, they shouldn't have to worry if a coat is supposed to be holding someone's territory.

I know that you know in your heart what I am trying to help you understand. In our humanness, we lose focus of the present for others. Without this vision we may leave someone behind and they may never experience the true grace and joy of community.
